Humanitarian Principles

Humanity

Human suffering must be addressed wherever it is found. The purpose of humanitarian action is to protect life and health and ensure respect for human beings.

Neutrality 2

Humanitarian actors must not take sides in hostilities or engage in controversies of a political, racial, religious or ideological nature.

Humanitarian Principles

3 Impartiality

Humanitarian action must be carried out on the basis of need alone, giving priority to the most urgent cases of distress and making no distinctions based on nationality, race, sex, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, class or political opinions.

4 Independence

Humanitarian action must be autonomous or independent from the political, economic, military or other objectives that any actor may hold about areas where humanitarian action is being implemented.



Power, Privilege and Intersectionality






Ability to influence **Power by** itself is neutral

Expression of Power

POWER WITHIN

Is the positive feeling we experience when we love and accept ourselves .Is the foundation for all other positive forms of power relates to a person's "sense of self-worth and self-knowledge"

POWER TO

Is when we take action as individuals to positively influence our own and others' lives. It is the power to make a difference, to create something new, or to achieve goals

Expression of Power

POWER WITH

Is when we join with others to improve our own and others' lives. Is shared power that grows out of collaboration and relationships? It is built on respect, mutual support, shared power, solidarity, influence, empowerment and collaborative decision making.

POWER OVER

Is when our words or actions make it difficult, frightening or even dangerous for others to use their own power. This type of power is built on force, coercion, domination and control, and motivates largely through fear.

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Intersectionality

Intersectionality looks at the multiple identities and experiences of individuals and communities, and the way those identities interact, overlap and shape how people are treated.

Intersectionality shows us how some identities result in privilege and more opportunities, while other identities result in oppression and/or additional barriers.

Privilege

Privilege refers to the advantages that an individual receives from belonging to a certain social identity group. Privilege is a right or exemption from liability or duty granted as a special benefit or advantage.
